Recently, Pacific Valley School had the pleasure of a presentation from Bob Redman. Redman was inspired by his father, whose career included 30 years at NASA's Armstrong Flight Research Center. Bob's youth was a time of historic breakthroughs in modern aviation. Bob's ingrained passion for space combined with his experience as a tour guide for the Smithsonian Institution motivated Bob toward the possibilities of teaching young people about

The STEM program (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) is a nationwide curriculum "that integrates the four subjects into a cohesive learning paradigm based on real world applications." Bob's presentations combine the STEM concepts with fun and exciting stories about landing on the Moon, life in space with zero gravity, Mars exploration and the International Space Station, for example. He has made a vast array of miniature rocket and robot models that duplicate the originals and he uses them during his presentations.

Bob explains how human beings have always been fascinated with outer space. First we invent telescopes to look into space. Then we sent rockets into space. Soon, we put astronauts in those rockets. Then, we sent astronauts to land and walk on the Moon (the footprints are still there). Later, we begin exploring Mars and actually have robots that have been there for years, like the rover Curiosity. Curiosity's mission is "to see if Mars ever could have supported small life forms called microbes...and if humans could survive their someday.'

Bob reminds us that the universe is fascinating and full of mystery. The solar system and beyond contains planets, moons, dwarf planets, the sun, stars, galaxies, black holes, dark energy and dark matter billions of light years away. All of these spark intrigue and curiosity in the hearts and minds of people everywhere. Bob has created a way for young people to begin to think about how they can help solve some of these most profound mysteries. PROPOSITIONS PASS TO BENEFIT **EDUCATION IN CALIFORNIA**

According to the official results of the November 8 ballots, California voters approved two important initiatives that support education funding and school facilities. Propositions 51 and 58 both promise to boost K-12 public schools, charter schools and community colleges by bringing stability in funding over the next 12 years.

Proposition 51 will provide about \$7 billion for K-12 school construction and \$2 billion for community colleges. Of the \$7 billion, \$3 billion is earmarked for new construction, \$3 billion will pay for modernization, \$500 million will be spent on charter schools and \$500 million will fund career technical education facilities. Proposition 55 will extend the state income tax on high income earners that raises billions of dollars a year for K-12 schools and community colleges.

Chris Unger, the California School Boards Association Presidents states, "Proposition 55 ensures that as much as \$4 billion per year stays in our classrooms and allows us to avoid program cuts and staff layoffs, while Proposition 51 provides the funding necessary to modernize our state's most outdated classrooms and to address the urgent needs in many communities for new school facilities. Matching funds from the state are critical to the construction and renovation of safe school buildings that promote 21st Century learning and support the physical, social and emotional health of our students"

How can Pacific Valley School benefit from these initiatives? Considering that new construction and modernization projects will require a 40%-50% local contribution match, it won't be easy. However, schools districts that demonstrate a lack of local contribution can apply for 100% grant funding. Currently, the school has applied for funds for a new fire alarm system. Many of our buildings are over 25 years old and in great need of replacement and/or upgrades. Unfortunately, another requirement of obtaining funding is demonstrating the "need" for new buildings based on student population. That makes it hard for our small school with a student body of 14 to compete with larger and wealthier school districts. Hopefully, PV School will benefit from these initiatives.
